## New Federal Funds for School Facilities How to Get Your Share

## State Fiscal Stabilization Fund

- \$8.8 billion (California: \$1 billion) that can include modernization, renovation and repairs to public school facilities



## Energy Investments

- \$6.3 billion for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Grants
- \$6.0 billion in loan guarantees for standard renewable projects such as wind or solar



## Transportation

- Possible alternatives to CEQA offsite facility requests from local government
  - \$27.5 billion for highway investments
  - \$8.4 billion for public transportation
  - \$1.5 billion for state and local competitive grants



## Other

- \$7.2 billion for broadband access
- \$2.1 billion for Head Start and Early Head Start
- \$2.0 billion for the Child Care Development block grant
- \$100 million for food and nutrition equipment



## Other

- \$100 million for school facilities in districts eligible for Impact Aid
- \$3.1 billion for repair, restoration and improvement of public facilities, including schools, on public and tribal lands.
