
**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 1D,  
THE STATE SCHOOL BOND MEASURE**

- WHEREAS,** California's public schools face severe overcrowding; and
- WHEREAS,** more than 60 percent of California's schools are 25 years of age or older and require major repairs; and
- WHEREAS,** the Division of State Architect has identified more than 7,000 school buildings that could benefit from upgrades to be earthquake safe; and
- WHEREAS,** adequate educational facilities are critical to preparing students for the workplace and high wage jobs; and
- WHEREAS,** the State estimates that the need to build new schools and repair older schools totals more than \$11 billion over the next five years; and
- WHEREAS,** the backlog of school district applications awaiting funding to repair old schools exceeds \$400 million and grows monthly; and
- WHEREAS,** our community colleges, state universities and college and university system needs additional funding to build new classrooms and repair older facilities; and
- WHEREAS,** the Anaheim City School District has identified a need of \$111 million to modernize and repair the schools in this District;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Anaheim City School District supports passage of Proposition 1D, the K-12/Higher Education statewide bond measure which appears on the November 2006 ballot.
